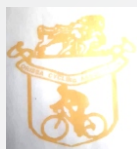







17th National Mountain Bike Championship Gadag, Karnataka from 19th Feb to 21st Feb 2021.

25th National Road Cycling Championship

Panvel, Navi Mumbai, Maharashtra from 5th March to 8th March 2021









25th Senior, Junior & Sub-Junior National Road Cycling Championship was organized by Cycling Association of Maharashtra with Cycling Federation of India at Panvel, Navi Mumbai, Maharashtra from 5th to 8th March 2021. Around 700 riders & Team officials in Senior, Junior & Sub-Junior boys & girls category from 27 States / Department participated in the championship under the guidance of 20 technical officials nominated by Cycling Federation of India, Mr. Ajit Singh was designated the chief commissaire for the said championship.




The Championships saw record participation and some fierce competition among the top cyclists of the Country. The championship was attended by a number of dignitaries from both the Cycling Association of Maharashtra and Cycling Federation of India.

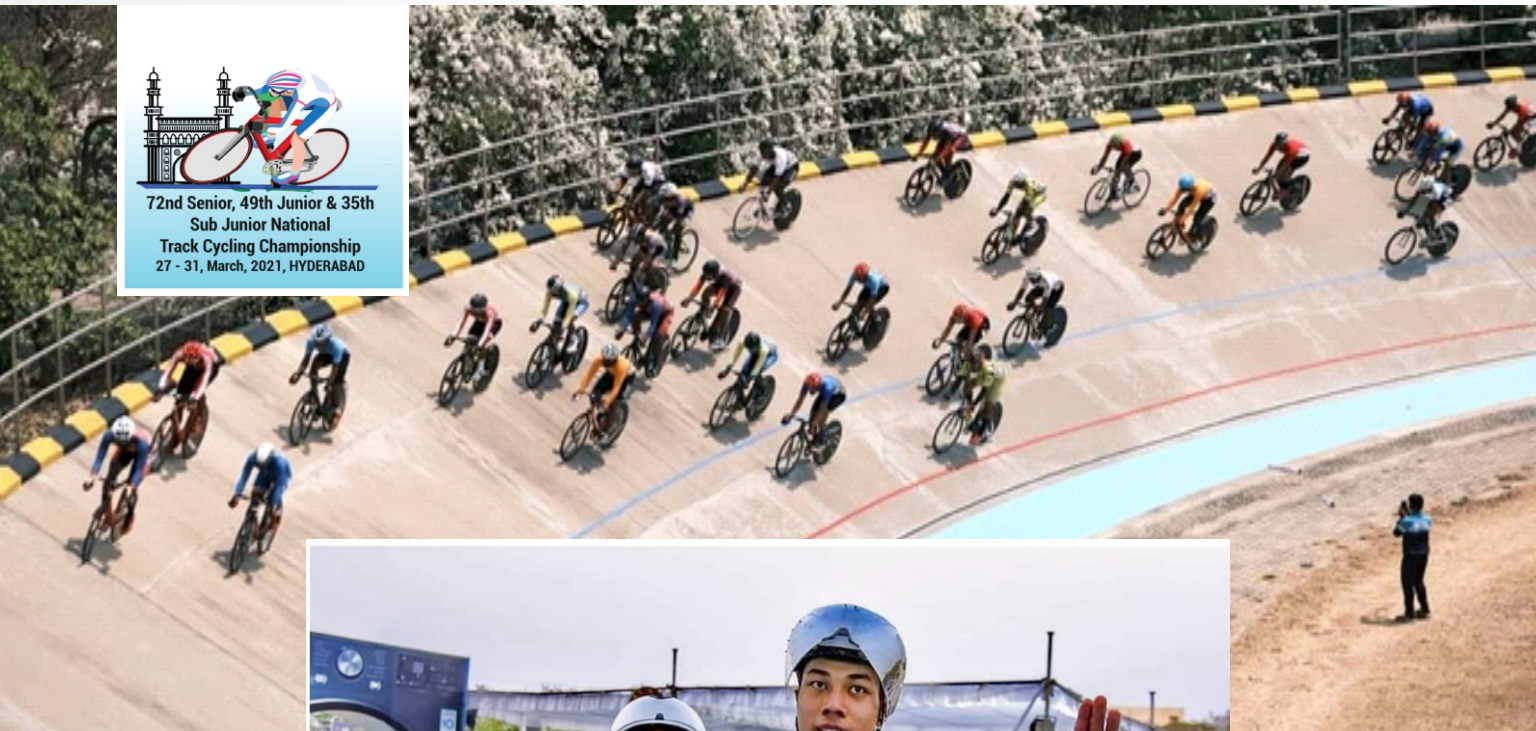

72nd Senior, 49th Junior & 35th Sub-junior National Track Cycling Championship was organized by Telangana Cycling Association. 
