

Total number of 487 Participants & Team Official from 25 States & Department took part in the above mentioned championships. Mr. K. Dattatraya was appointed the Chief Commissaire for the said championship.

This was the first time ever, where the State of Karnataka was Hosting a National Mountain Bike Championship. Sh. S. 25th National Road Cycling Championship Panvel, Navi Mumbai, Maharashtra from 5th March to 8th March 2021





25th Senior, Junior & Sub-Junior National Road Cycling Championship was organized by Cycling Association of Maharashtra with Cycling Federation of India at Panvel, Navi Mumbai, Maharashtra from 5th to 8th March2021. Around 700 riders & Team officials in Senior, Junior & Sub-Junior boys & girls category from 27 States / Department participated in the championship under the guidance of 20 technical officials nominated by Cycling Federation of India, Mr. Ajit Singh was designated the chief commissaire for the said championship.

The Championships saw record participation and some fierce competition among the top cyclists of the Country. The championship was attended by a number of dignitaries from both the Cycling Association of Maharashtra and Cycling Federation of India.

Even with the weather not favouring the cyclists, it did not deter them from performing to their absolute best. The support from local event organiser and determination of the Commissaires resulted in the event to become one of the most successful road National Championships.






72nd National Track Cycling Championships Hyderabad, Telengana from from 27th March to 31st March 2021



72nd Senior, 49th Junior & 35th Sub Junior National Track Cycling Championship 27 - 31, March, 2021, HYDERABAD





72nd Senior, 49th Junior & 35th Sub-junior National Track Cycling Championship was organized by Telangana Cycling Association. The Championship was held at SATS Cycling Velodrome, Osmania University, Hyderabad from 27th to 31st March 2021 with the support of Sports Authority of Telangana State and Telangana Olympic Association under the aegis of Cycling Federation of India. All the necessary guidelines for COVID as prescribed by the authorities were followed and the participants had taken the COVID test before arrival. Mr. Dharmendra Lamba was designated the chief commissaire for the said championship.

The accommodation for the participants and team officials was arranged nearby Nampally Railway Station, Hyderabad at Hotel Saiprakash & IMax Hotel to accommodate around 620 participants and team officials in senior, junior and sub junior category as well as Technical Officials who have taken part in the event. The Organizers had provided lodging and boarding to all the participant and team officials along with Technical Officials and local officials for smooth conduct of National Championship successfully

The National Championship was conducted after 13yrs at same venue whereas the 14 NEW NATIONAL RECORDS were created by the cyclists. Total 578 participants comprising of 336 Men, 169 women & 73 Technical Officials from 24 states and department had taken part. 




